RHYTHIS OF PRAYER in Scripture

One of the most note-worthy features of the life of Jesus was the way it was defined by prayer. More than miracles, more than teaching, His followers observed how the source and power of His remarkable life was prayer. So the request of those closest to Him was that He teach them to pray.

This is the greatest need and longing of Jesus' followers today. Many of us have read the stories of what God has done through prayer. We've heard the promises of what God will do if we pray. But we still live with a deep sense that there is more to be desired regarding prayer in our lives. As we bring these longings to the Lord, let's make the request of Jesus' first disciples ours today and say, "Lord, teach us to pray." Let's listen and look at the life of Jesus on the pages of Scripture and seek for His life of dependence on God in prayer to be formed in us.

WAYS TRAPPAGETISE Rhythms of Prayer

I was raised in a Christian tradition where a formal approach to prayer was often seen as something to be suspicious of. Making a formula out of prayer was religious and lacked any spiritual significance. Prayer was seen as more spiritual if it was spontaneous. But I have noticed what many others have known for some time. A vibrant, fulfilling prayer life is usually the right blend of strategy and spontaneity. As we talk about the rhythms of prayer, I want to give you a picture and then a practical way to practice what will bring new depth, freedom, and power to your life in prayer.

THE PICTURE

The picture is of Abraham ascending a mountain in Genesis 22 to do what you and I consider unimaginable. God had called him to offer his only son on an altar. The text says that Abraham told his son Isaac that they were going to worship, and we can see a powerful picture of prayer. Abraham hears from God, and as he responds in obedience, he knows that his journey requires preparation. He needs his son, the wood, fire, ropes to bind the sacrifice, and a knife to make the offering. In fact, at one point, Isaac sees all of these preparations, making him wonder why they have everything needed for the offering except a lamb. But even as Abraham prepares to go through with what we cannot comprehend, he remains open to God. Thus there is a beautiful spontaneous change of plans at the most crucial moment. God speaks, Abraham hears, Isaac is saved, God's provision is revealed, and Abraham's heart communes with his heavenly Father in a way that is so personal and profound. This presents a powerful picture of how the rhythms of prayer can look in our lives. The right blend of strategy and spontaneity. What would it look like to have a strategy for prayer that opens us to the spontaneous working of the Spirit?

FIRST, A WORD ABOUT STRATEGY:

We often need a better strategy to succeed in prayer. It is too easy to wander aimlessly. Our minds wander, and we repeatedly say the same thing and are easily distracted and discouraged. So it seems that the simple strategy of having a purposeful place and time set aside to pray, an appointed place to meet with God, will allow us to be much more successful in prayer. Another strategic preparation is to bring words, whether praying through Scripture, or prayer books, that will fill our minds with fuel to burn in the process of prayer, like the wood that Abraham brought for the altar.

A WORD ABOUT SPONTANEITY:

With all the right strategies, we still need a spark. For our prayers to not become monotonous and repetitious, we need to be ready in the moment for God to spontaneously speak and reveal His heart so that we can commune with Him. It is only in knowing that we are in the presence of the living God that our prayer times come to life.

THE PRACTISE

To make this as practical as possible, I recommend the following practice of rhythms of prayer in your daily life. Remember that these are recommendations, and you are encouraged to supplement, expand, or substitute these suggestions with anything that will enrich your time in prayer.

TIMES:

Set aside three times daily to pray (morning, mid-day, and evening). Start with something realistic and easily achievable to grow your capacity and excitement. I recommend just 5 minutes, to begin with. Let the first minute be in silence and then four minutes following where you are offering your heart in prayer.

WORDS:

Don't come empty-handed. Have your bible or a prayer book. As you read the words of others, pay attention to the sparks that start to ignite. The words of others will often spark spontaneous thoughts that become personal prayers. In this way, formal prayers become the fuel for the prayers flowing from our hearts.

As I write this, I'm praying that you will be inspired to seek new rhythms of prayer and that the strategy and spontaneity of your prayer life will lead you to more profound experiences of communion with our heavenly Father.

RHYTHIS OF PRAYER Resources and Tools

ENGAGE WITH LECTIO 365 AND PRAY EVERY DAY WITH 24-7 PRAYER Turn your biggest distraction (your phone) into a place of prayer. Inspired by Lectio Divina, Lectio 365 is a way of meditating on the Bible that's been used by Christians for centuries: follow daily Bible readings, thoughts and prayers that follow a simple P.R.A.Y rhythm: P:ause to be still. R:ejoice with a Psalm and R:eflect on Scripture. A:sk for God's help Y:ield to His will in your life. On Sundays, stop to pray a special Sabbath prayer of rest, and journey through special seasons including Advent. Lent and current events.

We also love the tools available from Lectio for Families, a free app for families to do together It features daily Bible readings, a weekly memory verse, engaging questions to pause and talk about, and prompts for reflection and prayer.

The app can be downloaded by parents and carers onto a mobile device. Families can then choose to either listen to the audio content together, wherever and whenever they are together, or they can read it as they pass the device to each other.


